Cemetery Rules/Regulations & Information

Kingston Township Board Of Trustees

- 1. Artificial flowers and wreaths are allowed but must be placed within 12 inches of the of the "monument and secured without the use of any metal or steel rods.
- 2. Cut flowers are permitted at any time and will be removed when wilted.
- Live flowers are required to be placed or planted in front and within 12 inches of the monument.
 The use of cans and glass bottles are not permitted.
- 4. The placing of boxes, chairs, glass and plastic blocks, tin cans, waste baskets, cardboard cartoons, etc. is not permitted.
- 5. The cemetery reserves the right to remove all floral designs, flowers, trees, shrubbery, and plants of any kind from the cemetery if they fail to conform to these rules and regulations. Roses are not permitted in the burial area of the cemetery but may be approved for planting in the Living Memorial Garden
- 6. Winter decorations such as natural and artificial wreaths placed on easels are permitted from November 1 to April 1st.
- 7. The cemetery grounds are cleaned of all winter decorations after April 1

- 8. If in doubt of proper or accepted grave decorations, kindly consult the Cemetery Sexton.
- 9. Permission for special planting must be obtained from the Kingston Township Trustees, the trees or shrubs planted become the property of the cemetery. Authorized personnel must plant them. They will be planted in the Blue Church Cemetery Living Memorial Garden area.
- 10. Information relative to laying of foundations, erection of monuments, placing of markers or headstones, internments and disinterment, and other related concerns, should be directed to the Cemetery Sexton
- 11. Ashes from cremations may not be scattered over the cemetery grounds, but must be in an urn and buried on a purchased grave site by cemetery personnel.
- 12. The Blue Church cemetery is open from dawn to dusk.
