APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

Members were informed that Executive Director Scott Sanders and the staff at the Delaware County Regional Planning Office have completed preliminary updates to the Comprehensive Plan. NEW BUSINESS:

Zoning Inspector Talbott briefly discussed potential plan modifications being considered for the Northstar Planned Residential Development (PRD) if a request is submitted by Nationwide Realty Investors (Nationwide). Any major amendment or rezoning request will come to the Zoning Commission for preliminary action. He informed Members that the Trustees are moving forward with Morton Buildings to construct the Township Hall this fall. Trustee Volpe is working with Nationwide regarding final plan requirements including the entrance roadway, picnic pavilion, utilities, sanitary system and others.

ZONING REPORT:

Zoning Inspector Talbott highlighted several items from the May through July, 2020 Trustee Report *referenced as Item 1* including number and type of zoning permits issued during the period, and discussed several complaints including the status of the Village Creek Farm Market and the Susan Barr, True North charity.

A number of newspaper articles from The Delaware Gazette and ThisWeek Community News from January through July, 2020 were distributed for Member information *referenced as Item 2* including pertinent issues facing Kingston and other townships in the county. A brief discussion took place regarding City of Delaware utility fees lawsuit, US 23 Corridor rebranding, and the Village of Kilbourne revitalization plans.
