Roads

The Blue Church Road Bridge project is behind schedule. The road should reopen in July.

Grader paving will occur in July on Blaney, Blue Church, and Stockwell roads, Wildwood Lane, and Todd Street.

Blue Church Road resurfacing with chip and fog seal from Rosecrans Rd. to SR 521 will tentatively occur starting Aug. 20

Delaware County's

work on Clark Road has been delayed. Two culvert bridges are being replaced and should occur at Pumphrey Ditch and at Walnut Creek.

The Ohio Department of Transportation is making bridge improvements along I-71 during 2015 and 2016. Roads will be closed one at a time from the north to the south including Kilbourne, SR 521, North Galena, and Berkshire roads. As we learn timing of these projects, we will pass the information along to you.

ROW Work

Please remember, if you do any work in the township road right-ofway, a permit is required. This includes mailboxes, culvert, ditch, and driveway work. Contact Road Superintendent Doug Crowl for more information and a permit application.

Trash Service

Residents are still having trash pickup problems. The trustees have invited Waste Management staff to attend their next meeting to discuss resolutions. If you have problems, contact Waste Management and Trustee Dewey Akers.

Fireworks Safety

Ohio law requires a license for the sale and use of fireworks. While consumers can buy

fireworks, it is illegal to discharge them in Ohio. Use of firecrackers, bottle rockets, etc. is illegal. These laws exist to protect the public and to regulate the fireworks industry in a fair manner.

M80s, M100s, quarter sticks, and similar devices are explosive devices, not fireworks. Since these devices are explosives, they are illegal for anyone to possess without a special license and/or permit.

If you discover illegal fireworks or any fireworks incident that results in injuries or property damage, call 911. Be aware that Kingston Township also has a noise ordinance.

New Gas Service

Bright Energy, a Consolidated Electric Cooperative company, plans to extend natural gas service in Kingston Township this fall. Exact locations are not yet defined but available service will only be east of I-71.

There will be a \$1,350 tap fee that includes the first 100' of service line to the house. Additional service line is \$4/foot. Common lines can be run to houses grouped closely so costs can be shared for longer driveways.
