ROADS & CEMETERIES

State Route 61/656 Roundabout

The Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) continues design work for the proposed roundabout at the intersection of State Route 61 and State Route 656/Wilson Road. The shape of the roundabout will resemble a peanut, and minimizes the project impact on adjacent neighbors. The target bid date is January 2021 with construction during the summer months.

Tentative traffic closure will occur between June 1st and October 31st. The total estimated cost of the project is \$2.1 million dollars with \$310,000 coming from an OPWC grant, \$17,250 from the Delaware County Engineers Office, and \$17,250 from Kingston Township. Since The Last Newsletter

For the months of February through April 2021, 2 driveway permits were issued, and approximately 90 tons of salt was applied to Township roadways for public safety.

The township continues to work with the County Engineers Office and impacted residents for the installation of a new drainage culvert under Todd Street Road and drainage improvements on the south side of the roadway.

During their May Monthly Meeting, the Trustees approved roadwork to be completed this summer including resurfacing Blue Church Road between Wilson Road and Rosecrans Road with chip and seal/fog coating. The same resurfacing will be applied to Stockwell Road from the Township Line west to State Route 61.

As you are driving the roadways within Kingston Township and see damage to the pavement or guardrails along the roadways, please contact Road Superintendent Doug Crowl to let him know at 740-815-8427. Repairs necessitated by motor vehicle accidents are costly so it saves taxpayer dollars if the responsible party can be held accountable for the repairs. A guardrail recently damaged on Blue Church Road cost the Township over \$2,800 to fix because the

operator of the vehicle that caused the damage fled the scene.

AROUND THE TOWNSHIP

Dangerous Intersections

The intersections of State Route 521 at North Galena and 3 B's & K Roads continue to be prone to traffic accidents. Within the past year, the Ohio Department of Transportation and the Delaware County Engineer's Office have upgraded standard stop signs with solar powered flashing stop signs and installed stop ahead warning signs for drivers approaching the intersections. Even with these improvements, accidents continue to occur. The Trustees continue to discuss the situation at both intersections with the Engineers County Office to explore additional measures to reduce vehicular crashes.

The picture below shows recent work by AEP to relocate power poles away from the North Galena intersection to avoid traffic crash impacts.



Lonely Steer

On April 19th, a lonely steer was found wandering Blue Church Road just south of the Township Maintenance Facility and Blue Church Cemetery. Local residents and

a Delaware County Sheriff Deputy and were able to direct the steer back to its pasture and secure it.



This situation is not unique. If you should see loose farm livestock on the road, immediately contact the Delaware County Sheriff Department by calling 911. Additionally render any assistance able to identify the owner of the animal, where it may have come from, and warn other approaching motorists of the hazard.

Grants

The Fire District makes every attempt to garner outside grant funding to support its operations and stretch tax funding for the District further.

Recently, the District again applied for a \$540,000 grant from the Assistance to Fire Fighters Grant Program (AFG) 2020 cycle to replace the 1994 Tanker that is used to transport water to fires where no source for water is available.

Thanks to the efforts of Lt. Pete Isbell, the District was recently awarded a pediatric training bundle through the Ohio EMS for Children Program. The program is designed to improve pediatric emergency care throughout Ohio. There were 90 packages awarded statewide and includes an airway management trainer, child and infant training manikins and access to a pediatric emergency care library.

Fan Donation Program

The Delaware County EMA is again collecting fans to benefit People in Need of Delaware County. The purpose of the program is to help provide heat relief during the summer months for those county residents who do not have air conditioning. Every donation does make a difference!

New box fans can be donated at all Delaware County EMS and Fire Stations between the hours of 8:00am and 7:00pm, seven days per week. If you are able to help, simply drop off a fan at our Porter Kingston Fire District located in Olive Green.

Electronics & TV Recycling June 5th

The DKMM Solid Waste District is offering Electronics and TV Collection at the Delaware County Fairgrounds on <u>June 5th</u> from 9:00am to 1:00pm for residents of Delaware, Knox, Marion and Morrow County. A photo ID is required. No dehumidifiers, air conditioners or large appliances.

Acceptable items include battery chargers, cables, computers components, and DVD/VHS players, fax machines, personal devices, microwaves, medical phones, projectors, routers, recording printers, devices. speakers, small scanners, appliances, stereo equipment, string lights, televisions, vacuum cleaners, video game systems, and video recording equipment. There is a \$20 fee per television; all other **electronics are free.** For more information on this and other recycling events this summer, please contact https://dkmm.org.

Tick Season Is Here

Always check for TICKS! Remember to wear long pants and sleeves that are light colored which make it easier to spot ticks. An appropriate repellent is recommended such as DEET for skin or Picaridin to clothing.

After removing a tick, the best practice is to keep the tick in a container in the freezer for 10 days after the bite as identifying the tick species may help with any medical problems. If a rash or other flu-like symptoms start in the 10 days after the exposure consult with your physician.

Remember:

TREAT clothing or skin with repellents.

INSPECT yourself, clothing and gear for ticks.

CLEAN any area where a tick was removed.

KEEP record of the date the tick was removed.

SHOWER as soon as possible after coming indoors.
