New Zoning Secretary/Assistant Zoning Inspector Bernie Cattrell

Bernie Cattrell brings a variety of education and experience to his new role as Zoning Secretary/Assistant Zoning Inspector for Kingston Township. After graduating from Brookhaven High School in Columbus in 1972, he settled in the insurance industry working as a loss prevention representative for commercial coverage.

In 1982, he went to work for the Clinton Township Fire Department in Columbus working his way up to the rank of Shift Lieutenant/EMS Coordinator for an engine company and medic unit. While there, he led the effort to computerize the department and upgraded emergency services from Advanced EMT to Paramedic status. For two years in the mid-90's, Bernie also worked as a paramedic in the Critical Care Transport Unit at Riverside Hospital in Columbus.



After 18 years with Clinton Township, Bernie moved to the Washington Township Fire Department in Dublin where he served as Fire Inspector for the next 16 years. His position with the department enabled him to assist township residents, building owners and contractors with questions and issues during property and construction inspections.

Retiring in 2016 after 34 years of public service, Bernie went to work for Cardinal Health in Dublin in their Security Services Division for another 6 years before joining the Kingston Township team in 2023.

Bernie received his Bachelor of Science degree in Business Management from Franklin University in 1996 and took numerous fire and EMS courses at Columbus State, general education courses at Ohio State, and engineering courses at the Illinois Institute of Technology throughout the years.

Bernie and his wife Charissa raised three sons in Westerville. As an Eagle Scout himself, Bernie became a Scout Master for his son's troop, and helped all of his sons and 32 other young men accomplish the same honor. During his time with the Boy Scouts of America, Bernie received several recognition awards for his dedication to scouting.

Bernie is looking forward to meeting all the township residents and hopes that you will stop at the Zoning Office on Thursday morning to say hello.

ROADS & CEMETERIES

Since The Last Newsletter

For the months of May through July, two driveway permits were issued. Three headstones were reset by RAR Monuments from Sunbury; two using insurance funding from a motor vehicle accident that caused damage to them, and one was reset using township funding due to base settlement. There were 2 interments in the Blue Church Cemetery during the period.

Old Township Hall Decision

Having looked at several options regarding the disposition of the Old Township Hall, the Trustees have decided to retain the brick portion of the structure for historic value and remove the wooden structure on the east side. Moving the structure was investigated but proved too costly for available fiscal resources. The existing propane tank will be relocated on township property, and the existing septic tank was located and abandoned in place following established health department procedures. This action resolves encroachment concerns expressed by adjacent neighbor Mary Ann Krauss. The picture below shows the location of the tank prior to abandonment.



<u>Culvert Replacement & Roadway</u> <u>Resurfacing Work</u>

The County Engineer's Office continues to evaluate a culvert issue on Todd Street Road just west of Clark Road in terms of size and capacity since water overtopped the roadway several times during summer storm events. They recently completed drainage improvement work at the west end of Rosecrans Road with a project cost of \$2,200.

The Trustees, in cooperation with the Delaware County Engineer, were notified that funding to resurface Twigg-Hupp Road has been approved by an Ohio Public Works Commission Grant. Grader paving has been completed to level out deteriorated spots in the roadway and resurfacing work should begin at the end of August. The project cost of approximately \$382,000 will include a funding match from the Township of approximately \$7,000 and \$21,000 from the Delaware County Engineer.

As you are driving the roadways within Kingston Township and see damage to the pavement (potholes), signs, or guardrails, please report the damage to Road Superintendent Fred Neace by <u>calling or texting 740-815-8427</u>. We need your help to ensure that our roadways remain safe. Winter will be upon us soon. Now is the time to check your mailboxes and posts to ensure they are stable and in good repair prior to when snowplowing begins.

Fan Donation Program

The Delaware County EMA is again collecting fans to benefit People in Need of Delaware County. The purpose of the program is to help provide heat relief during the summer months for those county residents who do not have air conditioning. Every donation does make a difference!

New box fans can be donated at all Delaware County EMS and Fire Stations between the hours of 8:00am and 7:00pm, seven days per week through Friday, September 15th. If you are able to help, simply drop off a fan at our Porter Kingston Fire District located in Olive Green.

EMS Grant Approved

The Fire District has received an EMS Grant totaling \$750.00 dollars from the Ohio Department of Public Safety. The funding must be spent by December 31, 2023, and will be used by the District to purchase EMS small equipment, supplies and training. Funding for this grant comes from seat belt fines.

Thermal Imaging Units Replaced

Outdated thermal imaging units have been replaced by the District at a cost of \$15,783. The purchase included 4 large handheld units, 6 smaller units and charging stations. The units are a critical piece of equipment when fighting structure fires as they look for heat differential in smoke filled rooms, and can identify the location of firefighters, other occupants in the room and where the fire is actually located inside and outside of a wall.

Other News

The District intends to send Lt. Wampler and Firefighter Yarnell to an Emergency Vehicle Operation Course (EVOC). The course will certify them as instructors and permit them to be able to teach the course to other firefighters in the District.

Two worn out Intake Valves were replaced at a cost of about \$4,000.00 dollars. Properly working valves are important when drafting water from either a pond or from a fire hydrant.
