Chairman's Chat By Bill Shively, Trustees Chairman

Hello everyone! I hope you all had a wonderful Thanksgiving holiday with family and friends. Now it is time for the shopping marathon to begin! The Trustees were informed that the Northstar developers are going to submit an amended development plan for the township's consideration. Meetings dates and times will be on the website.

The Trustees have been working hard to get the township hall and pavilion projects closer to completion. The parking lot was finally paved! The pavilions bathrooms are near completion and the main structure is waiting on the arched wood roof trusses to be delivered. This is going to be a wonderful addition to the township! The Trustees are planning a food preparation addition to the main meeting room of the Township Hall. We are attempting to get parking lot and entrance roadway lighting bid and installed.

I would like to welcome Trustee-Elect Angela Willyerd to the Board of Trustees and thank Trustee Dewey Akers for his 12 years of committed service to our township. Enjoy your retirement Dewy! Road Superintendent Fred Neace has done an outstanding job this year mowing and maintaining the roads and cemeteries. Zoning Inspector Dave Willyerd and Zoning Secretary Bernie Cattrell are doing an excellent job serving the zoning needs of our residents. Dave Stites has delayed his retirement until the Northstar proposed amendment is completed at the Zoning Commission level and a recommendation is forwarded to the Trustees for consideration.

2024 looks to be another exciting year! I want to wish everyone a very Merry Christmas and Happy New Year!

The Trustees also continue to work on several additional items including:

- Selling old and outdated equipment and furniture through the govdeals.com website.
- Repairing the soffit and gutter on the north side of the Maintenance Building, replacing two man doors and the overhead door and wrapping exposed trim in aluminum for long term stability.
- Rebidding of the farm ground lease. The current contract with Dylan and Todd Etgen (Etgen Farms) has reached the extension limit and must be rebid. The Trustees wish to recognize the Etgens for being great tenants and for partnership their work in reestablishing existing and expanding drain tile to maximize the amount of acreage available for crop production. The contract will be advertised in January and opened at the February 6, 2023 Trustee Meeting.
- Purchasing picnic tables and trash cans for the new Pavilion once it is completed.

- The submission of an Ohio Public Works Commission grant to repair and resurface Todd Street Road in 2024. The estimated cost for the township match would be \$35,457 dollars and include 1 ³/₄ inches of new asphalt with a chip seal topping.
- Finalizing demolition work to the east end of the old Township Hall and sealing up the furnace room area of the remaining brick structure which will remain long term as a historical static display.

Refuse/RecyclingContractRenewedThrough 2026

Based on quality of service and cost, the Trustees have extended the **Local Waste Services** refuse/recycling contract for three years through 12-31-26.

The current rate for 2023 is \$19.95 per month. The rate for 2024 and 2025 will increase (6%) to \$21.15 per month and increase again (3%) to \$21.78 per month in 2026. All provisions of the contract will remain the same including the 10% senior discount and pick up of one large item per week. Except for holidays, our pickup day of Wednesday will remain the same.

Total Solar Eclipse Coming April 8, 2024

This is a rare event occurring only 15 times since 1867 with the last one visible in parts of Kentucky in 2017. It will be the last one in North American until 2044 where it will be visible in only portions of North Dakota. The next totality eclipse in Ohio is in 2099.

The Delaware County Emergency Management Agency wants you to know that they are planning on its impact on all of Delaware County (extreme demand for hotels, campsites, restaurant, entertainment facilities, parks, etc.). Both the county and state are putting out the message: "Arrive Early, Stay Late, Stay Put". The county believes that will be stress on the local infrastructure including fuel, grocery, water, sanitation and traffic.

Expect heavy cell phone usage in the area on that day and don't use your phone to view the eclipse as the radiation can damage the phone.

<u>ROADS & CEMETERIES</u> Since The Last Newsletter

For the months of August through October, 0 driveway permits were issued. One foundation was repaired, and the headstone reset. There were 2 interments in the Blue Church Cemetery during the period and 2 natural burial plots and 1 traditional burial plot were sold. 3 grave plots were leveled, seeded and strawed.

Two 6' barricades were purchased for emergency road closure. A new 9" auger berm box (\$9,370) was also purchased for use in spreading salt and lining the berm of township roads with an aggregate when needed. In cooperation with the Morrow County Engineer, the Kingston Township portion of Clark Road was posted with reduced weight limits for January through July.

Both signs at the Blue Church Cemetery were replaced, and the new entrance sign for the Township Hall was installed.

Culvert Replacement & Roadway Resurfacing Work

PORTER KINGSTON FIRE DISTRICT Santa Tour of Porter Kingston Fire District

The District apparatus will escort Santa Claus on the 12-hour longish 2023 tour on December 17th. Go to their Facebook page, **Porter Kingston Fire District Santa Tour** for further information including the official schedule and route or to message them your address.

In other news, the District has received multiple financial grants this year that help it to provide service to the residents of the district and protect the health of its firefighters. Most recently it received a \$13,940 grant from the Ohio Bureau of Workers Compensation to purchase a gear dryer that will service 6 sets of turnout gear at a time. The Ohio BWC had given PKFD a grant several years ago to purchase a washer for the gear. The dryer has already been received.

They also received an EMS Grant of \$2,975. They used it to purchase 2 Automatic External Defibrillators. One will be installed at the Porter Township Hall and the other replaces an old, discontinued and no longer serviceable AED on the apparatus.

Over the summer the District used \$4,460 to purchase a SuperVac ventilation fan powered by the same 18 volt batteries used in many of their other power rescue and fire tools. It can be connected via electric cords to the fire apparatus when the batteries go dead. The fan has been ordered but not yet received. It is used to force smoke from structures, as fires are extinguished.

Finally, the District has 2 new applicants that are in the process of receiving their fire training at the Delaware Area Career Center. They both will begin their EMS training in January.
